Your 'At a Gla<u>nce' Guide to ministry</u> around the Anglican Communion





Welcome to your 'at a glance' guide to resources for intentional discipleship and disciple-making. Here are a selection of resources that are freely available for your diocesan and provincial training schemes and colleges, and for all clergy and laity.





Jesus Christ urged his disciples to "go and make disciples of all nations". Anglicans and Episcopalians around the world are still responding to that 'Great Commission' in daily discipleship by supporting evangelism, training, and church growth globally.

A Season of Intentional Discipleship and Disciple-Making (SIDD) was launched at the Anglican Consultative Council in Lusaka in 2016: 'In light of the Gospel and theological imperative to make disciples, [we] recognise the need for every province, diocese and parish in the Anglican Communion to adopt a clear focus on intentional discipleship and to produce resources to equip and enable the whole church to be effective in making new disciples of Jesus Christ.' (ACC-16 Resolution 16.01).

This was re-affirmed in 2019 at ACC-17 in Hong Kong and the season will run until ACC-19 in 2026. Up to now, well over 100 dioceses and many of the 42 provinces of the Anglican Communion have formally adopted Intentional Discipleship as a key priority and/or have hosted consultations and workshops on this subject.





All across the Anglican Communion people are rediscovering how following Jesus shapes every part of their lives. In Cyprus and the Gulf they call this 'Doing Good and Doing God'; in the Church of England it is 'Setting God's People Free'; in the USA it is a call to 'The Way of Love'; and in Kenya it is 'A Wholesome Ministry for a Wholesome Nation'.

After a consultation in Jamaica on whole-life discipleship, Archbishop Howard Gregory observed, 'I have never seen such enthusiasm and energy in a Church gathering. Men and women, children and youth in every parish are being trained and helped to live a Jesus-shaped life. In South Afric large numbers gather as 'Anglicans Ablaze,' while in Ghana Archbishop Daniel Sarfo has said 'This focus on whole-life discipleship is exactly what the Church in my country needs at this time.' Archbishop Justin Welby has commented that 'The best decision anyone can ever make, at any point in life, in any circumstances, whoever they are, wherever they are, is to become a disciple of Jesus Christ.'

Part of this movement is all about investing in work with children and young people. To that end two Youth and Children Ministry Awards are presented at the triennial ACC meetings. The awards recognise excellent work to nurture and grow disciples among children and youth.





In Chile, a focus on mission, discipleship and leadership has led to a reported 30% growth of the church since 2000. Clergy and lay leaders actively search out young people, mentor them and offer a one-year walk along program with a parish priest. One young person said, 'I was only a nominal Christian until someone came alongside and mentored me to fullness of faith.'

Several inner-city churches in Kuala Lumpur are working to provide schooling for refugee children from Myanmar. Churches are full of children and teachers every day, and it is proving to be life-changing for the children and a powerful Christian witness to their families. One example is St Barnabas' School for the Rohingya children.

Episcopalians in the United States are reclaiming and embracing the ministry of evangelism, and it is remaking the whole church. As they walk the Way of Love, and practice blessing the world with their stories of life with Jesus, they're helping their neighbours to grow in relationship with Jesus, too. Thousands of Episcopalians have participated in evangelism training, in which they learn to share and celebrate faith stories. One popular exercise is Cardboard Testimonials: recalling your own story of resurrection and capturing the essence of the story on two sides of cardboard, then sharing the story of God's love and faithfulness with a partner.
